The new Delta Air Lines flight from Naples to Atlanta, the busiest airport in the world, has started on May 24

The connection adds to the already existing Delta flight from Naples to New York/JFK

Naples, May 26, 2025 – Delta Air Lines' new flight from **Naples** to the **Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport**, the American airline's main hub and the busiest airport in the world, has started operating on **Saturday, May 24**. The connection operates **four times a week** throughout the summer season, and also offers passengers the option to continue their journey with connecting flights via the Atlanta hub to destinations throughout North America and beyond. Last year, Delta also began serving Naples with a seasonal daily connection to New York/JFK, operating in 2025 from May 8. In 2024, Delta carried more than 56,000 passengers on the Naples – New York route.

"Following the success of the flight from Naples to New York, we are excited about this new connection to our Atlanta hub. The launch of this second flight is part of a broader expansion strategy in Italy, the transatlantic market in which we are growing the most in summer 2025, launching a total of four new routes and significantly increasing the frequency of several existing connections compared to the previous year", said **Matteo Curcio, Delta Senior Vice President Delta for Europe, Middle East, Africa and India**

"The new direct flight Naples-Atlanta marks a strategic step for the connectivity of our airport, expanding travel opportunities to the United States and connecting Naples with hundreds of destinations through the busiest hub in the world. This new route further consolidates our partnership with Delta, which already successfully operates the flight to New York/JFK and confirms the international attractiveness of Naples and the Campania region. The enhancement of transatlantic connections, with 6 direct destinations to North America in the summer season, represents a strategic asset for the development of tourism and the economic growth of our region. We will continue to invest with determination to ensure that our airport is up to the challenges of expansion, combining growth with our concrete commitment to the environment and the territory that hosts us" said **Roberto Barbieri, CEO of GESAC**.

Delta operates the new flight from Naples to Atlanta using 223 seat A330-200 aircraft, featuring Delta One lie-flat seats, Delta Premium Select, Delta Comfort+ and Main Cabin classes of service.

Delta One customers can enjoy lie-flat seats with premium bedding made from recycled materials, along with a seasonal, chef-curated four-course dining experience and a sophisticated wine list, including Taittinger Champagne. Additionally, thanks to the partnership with Italian luxury fashion house Missoni, Delta One customers can look forward to a Missoni customer amenity kit and top-of-the-line details woven into key touchpoints throughout the Delta One travel experience.

Delta Premium Select offers extra room to relax with wider seats, deeper recline, and enhanced service. Passengers in all cabins will enjoy curated food and beverage options and access to over 1,000 hours of entertainment through Delta Studio.

As part of its endeavours in innovation and technology, the carrier is equipping its international flights with fast, free Wi-Fi. Already today, all customers flying on Delta's transatlantic network between Europe and the U.S. have access to free, fast Delta Sync Wi-Fi powered by T-Mobile.

Delta is also investing in its customer experience at the airport before departure with the opening of its new Delta One Lounges in New York, Boston and Seattle. In Atlanta, Delta opened a new 24,000-square-foot [Sky Club](#) this April. The Sky Club can accommodate up to 500 guests and is inspired by the architecture and hospitality of the American South in its furnishings and design.

During the 2025 summer peak season, Delta will operate up to 110 weekly flights between Italy and the United States. In addition to the routes from Naples to Atlanta and New York/JFK, Delta's overall schedule will include direct connections from Rome Fiumicino to New York/JFK, Atlanta, Boston, Detroit and Minneapolis, from Milan Malpensa to New York/JFK, Atlanta and Boston, from Venice Marco Polo to New York/JFK and Atlanta and from Catania to New York/JFK.
